

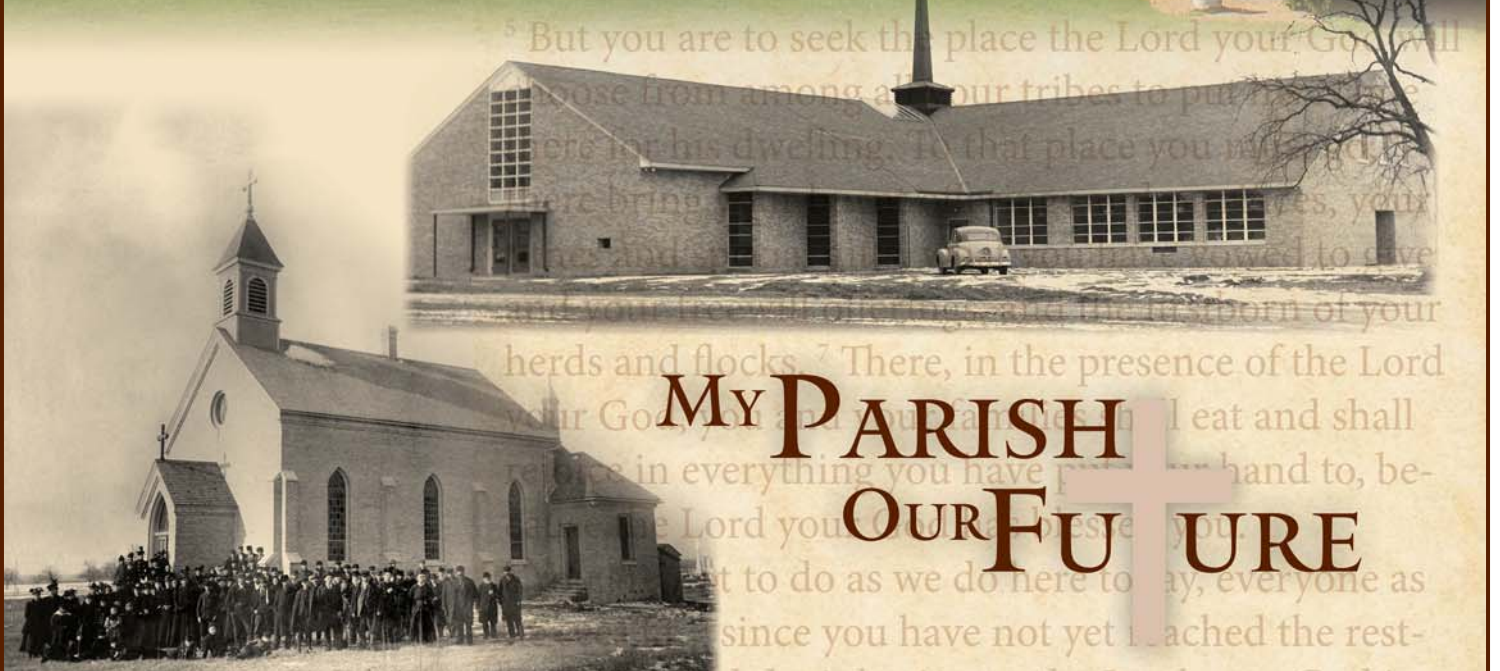

If we start our reflection on the basis of what is in our pocket, we will remain in our selfishness and never make a fruitful response. *The answer is discovered in our reflection on God’s various forms of generosity, the gift of faith and the gift of redemption that God offers us through Jesus Christ, the Word of God and the beautiful Sacraments of the Church. That is what moves us to become selfless disciples and sacrificial “givers.”* We become generous “givers” of our time, our talent and our treasure. *It is in practicing Christ-like sacrificial giving (giving that stretches us, is a reach for us or costs us something) that we experience and gain our greatest sense of fulfillment, meaning, change, happiness, blessing and closeness to God and one another in our life.* This is born out in the Word of God, psychology, sociology and people’s



experience. It has a whole lot to do with following God’s will, not our own. God isn’t expecting everyone to give the same size gift or amount of time, *but* God does call each one to give a sacrificial gift out of gratitude. That is how the Kingdom of God is built.

The “**My Parish – Our Future Campaign**” calls for and needs everyone’s participation, big or small. It is that participation that creates our community’s spirit and unity. This campaign helps us take pride in our parish and helps us feel the partnership of one another. It is an opportunity to invest in God’s work. Each one is called to do their part. VETERANS DAY • NOVEMBER 11

I have told this story before. Our old buddy, Ray Rudnick, who died on June 26, 2012, used to come to me to share stories about the importance of **Veterans Day!** He always made a distinction for me about the fact that Memorial Day was primarily to remember those who died in war, while Veterans Day was to honor those veterans still living or who died back home after the war. Veterans Day was originally celebrated as “Armistice Day” a year after the 1st World War ended in 1918. The armistice agreement was signed between Germany and the Allies on 11/11/18. Most of the Allied nations also celebrated Armistice Day and many nations incorporated the red poppy as a symbol honoring their fallen soldiers. In 1921, a tomb of an “unknown soldier” who was killed in France was created in Arlington Cemetery, and Armistice Day became a federal holiday. The federal holiday honoring WWI veterans living and dead, was expanded *in 1954* to include veterans of other wars. *At that time Armistice Day officially became Veterans Day.* I love hearing about the recognition being given to veterans who are still able to make the trek to Washington D.C. on the “Honor Flights.”

We need to remember the sacrifices of all those who fought for our heritage of freedoms. Pray for those who are retired from the military and for those who are still serving. As you offer those prayers, pray for peace throughout the world, especially on this November 11th. ~Fr. Ralph

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH:

KEEP TIRES INFLATED TO PROPER PRESSURE

When: Check when the tire is cold in the morning before driving or after the car has been sitting for a few hours. Optimally check tire pressure once a month.

Why: Properly inflated tires will help optimize fuel economy, will maximize the life of the tires, stabilize the tire's structure as well as maintain the best braking and handling performance. Under-inflated tires are a cause of auto crashes and tire inflation is one of the easiest safety services to perform.

What you can do: Keep tires inflated to the pressure recommended by the auto manufacture. Use a quality air gauge—**visual inspection** of the different kinds of tires (radial, off the road) found on vehicles today **is not accurate**. Do not use the "Max" found printed on the tire. Pressure recommendations are found on the driver side doorjamb or the inside of the glove box or in the Owner's manual.
