



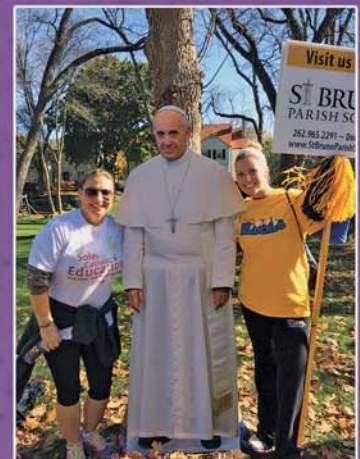

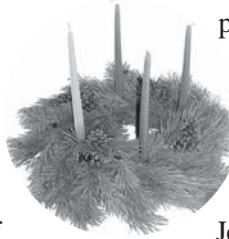

WELCOME TO ADVENT



Advent – from the Latin *adventus* which means “to come”. A coming into place, view, or being; arrival. An arrival or coming, especially one which is awaited.

Advent, historically, was a time for penance and preparation, much like Lent. Though it is still a part of the preparation, penance has become less a part of Advent preparation (at least with respect to the emphasis on penance we see in Lent). One of the most popular symbols of Advent has become the *Advent wreath*. The origin of the Advent wreath is uncertain, but it has become one of the ways that helps with our preparation as we count down with longing for the celebration of Christmas (God’s incarnation into our world).

The symbolism of the Advent wreath is really quite beautiful. The many types of evergreens that are used symbolize continuous life. The circle of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternal nature of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. Pine cones and seed pods remind us of the resurrection and life.

Along with the wreath are the four candles. Traditionally, you will find three purple and one rose. There have been many meanings set with each of the purple candles (prayer, penance, preparatory sacrifices done at this time/hope, faith,

peace). The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday (Gaudete Sunday) – the week of joy and rejoicing. It is the Sunday that marks when we have made it past the midpoint of Advent in our preparation.

The light of the candles symbolizes our growing expectation and hope that surrounds the coming of Jesus in the past, present and future. As the light of day diminishes, the light of the candles increases, until the blazing light of Christ bursts into the world as the Angels sing, “Glory to God in the Highest and on earth peace to people of good will.”

The Advent wreath can be easily adapted to use at home as a continuation of our communal celebrations. You can construct a simple wreath with candles and if no wreath material is available, four candles can be used or perhaps a simple drawing where a candle is colored every Sunday to mark the days of our Advent journey.

The important thing to remember, as I see it, is that as we wait with eager anticipation, we prepare ourselves in a special way during this time, and in the din of all the craziness of the Christmas season, we take time to be quiet and allow the glow of the light of the Advent wreath to fill us with hope, faith, joy and peace.
